Today's Gospel gives us a salutary lesson. Jesus identifies Martha's problem as anxiety - that is directed in being "anxious about many things." We, like Martha, need to not be so anxious about things.

We need to slow down and listen to Jesus' words and deeds, not be distracted and then bring the understanding of this into our daily lives and everything we do. The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'
