

THE STONING OF STEPHEN: Stephen was a man who was respected and had a very good reputation. He was one of the Seven appointed by the apostles as a servant. We are told that he was full of God's grace and power and he performed miraculous signs. It is also shown that Stephen was a dynamic and wise speaker. He went to the synagogue to teach about Christ.

The Jews at the Synagogue spread lies that Stephen was blaspheming against Moses, God and the temple. When the High Priest asked Stephen if the charges were true Stephen went on to show his devotion to God by telling the story of how God worked through his people to bring Jesus to the world even though throughout Israel's history they kept rejecting those God sent to them to lead and rescue them.

To put someone to death they required the approval of the Roman Procurator. In most cases though, the Roman procurator bent to the demands of the Sanhedrin. It is interesting to note that the Stoning of Stephen was most likely illegal, as there is no indication of the Sanhedrin seeking the confirmation of the Roman procurator. By comparison the crucifixion of Christ went through all the "proper" routes of justice and was a legal (although unjust) crucifixion.

After the Stoning of Stephen followers of Christ began to leave Jerusalem to escape further persecution. The good news about Jesus began to spread because, wherever they went, they told others about Christ. Stephen was a faithful follower of Christ whose only crime was obedience to the Lord. He is referred to as the first Christian martyr.
