### **KNOWING THE LITURGY: Did you know?**

Jesus is more present than we may think! In addition to the real presence of Jesus reserved in the tabernacle, there are two further important places where the church teaches Jesus is present throughout the mass (not present as in the 'real presence' but present as an important aspect of our encounter with him).

The first is the Altar itself. A consecrated Altar is an important symbol of Jesus, as it points to the sacrifice of His passion, remade at every mass.

The second is the book of the Gospels, which is an important manifestation of Jesus' presence, as through it we hear His words.

Both the altar and the book of the Gospels are venerated throughout the Mass. The priest kisses the altar at the start and end of mass, and the book of the Gospels is also kissed by the priest after the Gospel reading. Both are also venerated with incense as a special sign of their importance and holiness.

### Hope: did you know?

....that Hope is a theological virtue, together with Faith and Charity. It is theological in that it directly relates to God and helps Christians to live *in a relationship* with the Holy Trinity (CCC 1812).
