Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and RCIA

Baptism: Please contact me and collect the application after one of our weekday Masses. Only six people are allowed to the celebration. Our new co-ordinator of Baptism catechises is *Donella Canelle*.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation:

- The last date to submit your application is 17th January [Sunday].
- From February, you will have your classes via Zoom.
- From 17th April (after the Easter holidays) we hope to have regular classes at Hartley Hall.
- In October, we shall have the celebrations of the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Anne Mellis is our co-ordinator of First Holy Communion Catechists and from April the classes will be held from 10am on Saturdays.

Franck Angubi is our new co-ordinator of the Sacrament of Confirmation catechises and the classes will begin at 4.45pm on Saturdays [4.45pm to 5pm – refreshments and socialising; 5pm to 5.15pm – prayer time; 5.15 to 6.15 – catechises; 6.15pm to 6.30pm – preparation for the Mass as candidates will be expected to take up different responsibilities in the Mass].

Second reading [Galatians 4:4-7] When the appointed time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born a subject of the Law, to redeem the subjects of the Law and to enable us to be adopted as sons. The proof that you are sons is that God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts: the Spirit that cries, 'Abba, Father', and it is this that makes you a son, you are not a slave anymore; and if God has made you son, then he has made you heir.

Gospel Acclamation [Heb1:1-2]

Alleluia, alleluia!

At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our own time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke 2:16-21 The shepherds hurried away to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. When they saw the child they repeated what they had been told about him, and everyone who heard it was astonished at what the shepherds had to say. As for Mary, she treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds went back glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen; it was exactly as they had been told.

When the eighth day came and the child was to be circumcised, they gave him the name Jesus, the name the angel had given him before his conception.
