## *SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER* *15/16 May 2021*

Dear friends,

This weekend we celebrate World Communications Day. This day invites us to be the messengers/storytellers of God's Good News.

Not all stories are good stories. For example, the serpent said in the beginning: "when you eat of it...you will be like God" [Gen 3:4]; and still says: "if you possess, if you have riches...you will become, you will achieve..."

The story of stories is the Sacred Scripture. It is the greatest story between God and man. The Lord God wants us to be His storytellers, saying: "That you may tell your children and grandchildren" (Ex 10:2). Reading, reflecting and telling God's stories always renews and refreshes us.

Technology enables us to take this story telling to the ends of the earth. We are doing good in using the technology we have to proclaim God's stories in our parish. **Laudato Si:** Catholics around the world are invited to take part in celebrations to mark the Laudato Si' 5th Anniversary Year.

The 10-day event, which will run between 16th - 25th May inclusive, is intended to celebrate the progress that the global Church has made in its ecological conversion journey during the past six years, as well as offer a path for the decade ahead. In his recent Earth Day message, Pope Francis strongly highlighted that it is '*time to act*' on the environment, calling for integrated global efforts towards protecting the planet and pointing out that the Earth may no longer continue to be disrespected.

The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, in association with the Global Catholic Climate Movement and a large number of partner organisations and charities, will deliver '*Laudato Si Week*', centred around the theme '*For we know things can change*'.

During the course of the celebration, there will be an opportunity to view a range of live broadcasts on environmental topics under the banner of **Laudato Si Dialogue**, which will highlight critical opportunities to create environmental change. The daily broadcasts will take place at 7 pm (BST), and in addition to exploring various topics, such as fossil fuels, there will also be an opportunity to take part in a Global Action Day for our Common Home, enjoy a cultural festival and engage in a prayer gathering. ## MASS READINGS

**First reading Acts 1: 15-17, 20-26**

**'Let someone else take his office'**

One day Peter stood up to speak to the brothers – there were about a hundred and twenty persons in the congregation: ‘Brothers, the passage of scripture had to be fulfilled in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, foretells the fate of Judas, who offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus – after having been one of our number and actually sharing this ministry of ours. Now in the Book of Psalms it says:

Let someone else take his office.

‘We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord Jesus was travelling round with us, someone who was with us right from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us – and he can act with us as a witness to his resurrection.’

Having nominated two candidates, Joseph known as Barsabbas, whose surname was Justus, and Matthias, they prayed, ‘Lord, you can read everyone’s heart; show us therefore which of these two you have chosen to take over this ministry and apostolate, which Judas abandoned to go to his proper place.’ They then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.
