JUBILEE COCKTAIL

Ingredients:

50ml Gin 8 basil leaves, plus extra

50ml apple juice to garnish

50ml grapefruit juice 100-150ml sparkling wine 25ml lemon juice Grapefruit wedge and

Ice basil, to garnish

Preparation time: 5min

Add the gin, apple juice, grapefruit juice, lemon juice and basil leaves to a cocktail shaker with ice and shake vigorously. Strain into a stemmed glass, filling by half, and top with sparkling wine.

Method:


Add the ice and fruit to a jug, add the Pimm's, wine and lemonade.
