The Holy Trinity - Introduction

Summary: At the heart of our Catholic faith is the mystery of the Holy Trinity - one God in three divine Persons: the Father, the Son (Jesus), and the Holy Spirit. They are distinct but inseparable. This is a mystery we cannot fully grasp, but we believe it because God has revealed it to us. The Father is the source of all creation. Jesus, His Son, came to save us, revealing the Father's love. The Holy Spirit guides and sanctifies us, leading us closer to God. Through Baptism, we share in the life of the Trinity.

Reflection: Just as we have different roles in our families (mother, father, child), so too does God exist in three Persons, each with a unique role in our salvation. However, unlike human families, God is perfectly united in love. We can reflect this Trinity in our own lives by working together as a community, each using our unique gifts to build up the kingdom of God.

Question for Discussion in your Family: How can we, as a community of believers, reflect the love and unity of the Holy Trinity in our relationships with one another?

Bible Verse to Remember: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

New Lectionary Coming This Advent (Part 1)

A revised Lectionary, the book containing Scripture readings for Mass and Sacraments, will be introduced this Advent as part of an ongoing effort to enhance liturgical translations. This means that the books currently used for Mass readings, including blue

missals, will no longer be valid starting in December.

What's Changing:

The new Lectionary will be based on the English Standard Version: Catholic Edition (ESV-CE) and the Abbey Psalms and Canticles (APC). While the Scripture passages themselves remain similar, this update offers a fresh and more accurate translation of the texts. This change is part of a global initiative to modernize liturgical translations for greater fidelity to the original texts, incorporate current language usage, and benefit from the latest biblical scholarship.

As we embark on this exciting journey, let's embrace the opportunity to hear the Word of God with renewed ears and hearts.

We are proud that **Piero Finaldi**, CEO of CTS, hails from our parish. CTS was appointed by the local Bishops' Conferences to publish the official ritual editions of the Lectionary for England & Wales and Scotland. All the best and Congratulations dear Piero! (Stay tuned for **Part 2** of this announcement next week, with more details about the new Lectionary.)
